

A Punxsutawney, PA man was arrested for public drunkenness after witnesses saw him try to give CPR to a victim of a hit and run accident. Donald Wolfe knelt beside the deceased and waved his hands at first as if trying to conduct a séance, before starting CPR. The state trooper who arrived on the scene watched in disbelief because the victim was a dead possum whom the trooper described as, “having been dead for a while.”

A 27-year old Connecticut man and a 16-year old accomplice were arrested for trying to rob a bank. In an effort to save time the pair phoned the bank 10 minutes before arriving and told employees to get a bag of money ready. The would-be robbers were surprised to arrive at the bank and find police waiting for them. Sgt. James Perez called the two were, “not too bright.”
